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

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE



ROOM ASSIGNMENT/MOVE-IN INFORMATION

Visit the Housing Portal at my.tcu.edu to view details of your room, roommate(s), and move-in date and time. You can change your move-in time until August 3. Go to the Housing Portal, look there to see what other days or times are open, cancel your assigned time and then choose a new day/time.



ROOMMATE COMMUNICATION

Some questions you should ask your future roommate before moving in are:

- Do you want to coordinate dorm decor?



HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All incoming students must submit a full health history form, located on the TCU Student Health Portal, and comply with the vaccination requirements. The deadline for immunizations this year has been extended to August 1, 2020. If you have questions, please call the TCU Health Center at 817-257-7940.



MAILING PACKAGES

Students can start shipping packages to their TCU mail box starting July 13. Students with oversized packages or an abundance of packages (anything they would need help transporting) in the Post Offices possession by 8/1 will be placed in student rooms. MOVE-IN DAY INSTRUCTIONS

GET READY

Check your TCU email for your assigned move-in day and check-in time. Print out the confirmation email for your records.

ARRIVE ON CAMPUS

Drive to campus and head to LOT 3 - just off Cantey Street. Pull your car into LOT 3 at your check-in time. Cars arriving before their designated times will be asked to wait in LOT 4.*

CHECK IN

Stay in your car and follow the lines to the check-in tent. At the check-in tent, you will be given your TCU ID card.

*Your move-in timeslot will remain as-is, but the suggested arrival time is what we have below. Please note that for those who are approved to move in early on August 10, there will be no 5 PM timeslot. GET AN UNLOADING PASS

You will stay in your car and pull into the line for your hall. TCU PD will be there to direct you into the line. You will be given an unloading pass. You CANNOT access the unloading area for your hall without this unloading pass.

5 UNLOAD

Drive to your hall when released and unload. As soon as your car is unloaded, it MUST be moved to an approved parking lot/garage.

6 GET YOUR KEY


Check in to your hall and receive your room key from the TCU Housing staff.

7 MOVE IN




MOVE-IN TIPS

HALL DIRECTOR (HD)

HDs are full-time, Masters-level professionals that live and work within the residence halls. This position carries the responsibility of providing a comprehensive residence life program for their residents. One of their primary responsibilities is to build relationships with their residents and RA staff to create an exceptional residential experience.



RESIDENT ASSISTANT (RA)

RAs are undergraduate students who have been selected on the basis of their ability to communicate, willingness to accept responsibility, enthusiasm to help others, and familiarity with the University. RAs work to establish and maintain a living environment conducive to a successful educational experience as well as being a resource to students.



DESK ASSISTANT (DA)

DAs are part-time student employees who are responsible for the front desk operations in each residence hall. Primary duties of a DA include customer service, community building, and safety. A DA represents the residence hall in which they work, as well as the TCU Community as a whole.

WASHERS AND DRYERS

Washers and dryers are conveniently located within each hall and service is provided at no additional cost at time of use. Please use high efficiency detergent and read all posted signs for operation.



UNIVERSITY LAUNDRY

TCU has a laundry service for students, staff and faculty. The program includes Bundled Service (wash/dry/fold/package by hand) and Campus Cleaners (dry-clean or launder and press, return on hangers). You can update the laundry request on the Housing application.

OTHER ROOM DETAILS

LOFTS

Partitions, room dividers, other structures and lofts of any type are not permitted. The exception is in these halls (Waits and sorority and fraternity facilities) that have loftable beds, and lofting equipment is available through the hall office. Lofted beds must be dismantled before check-out time and equipment returned to designated areas. For instructional videos, view our Youtube channel.

WALLS & CEILINGS

Televisions may not be mounted to walls. Contact paper, corkboard, upholstery fabric, or wallpaper may not be used on walls, shelves, or furniture. No structural or electrical alterations (including the installation of ceiling fans) may be made.

PROGRAM	WHAT'S IT?	SAFETY MEASURES
Mats & Chats	Design welcome mats for your room! Mats and paint will be supplied.	All residents must register so we can properly set-up social distancing stations. Materials will be wiped down.
Wellness Night	Pick-up face masks and essential oil bags at the front desk. Essential bags to be pre-made and residents will select their scent to add.	Wear masks at all times. Residents to maintain social distancing guidelines while waiting to pick up masks and essential oil bags.
Ping Pong Tournament	Ping pong table set in the center of the lobby so residents are able to view from all angles at a distance while two people hash it out on the table.	Most tables are already 6 feet or longer. We will limit spectators to a safe number and distance and have people swap out. Paddles will be wiped down after each round.
Bingo Night	Caller gets a mic and calls bingo.	Everyone will receive a paper bingo card and use their own pen to limit sharing.
Sustainability program	Residents will be able to plant their own flowers in small pots and keep to watch their progress on their plant.	We will have different stations for each part of the sustainability program that are spaced out. Residents will be required to wear a

mask and we will have RAs and residents able to be physically

distanced.

Hall Belonging and Inclusion

Students will put their thumbprint on a notecard and write some of their identities on the card to be hung up in the lobbies. Hand sanitizing stations will be present so that each student can sanitize their hands after placing their thumbprint on their card.

Movie night on the lawn

Students can RSVP to be on the lawn with picnic blankets or students can watch the movie from their windows.

We will also have a movie snack cart go to every floor with individually wrapped candies and all RA's wearing masks/gloves.

Guess That Tune

Residents get in small teams (or individually) and listen to short clips of songs from the 70, 80s, 90s, 2000s, 2010s, and today and write down the name of the song and the artist.

There are three rounds and a final round with the top five player/teams.

These answers will be collected via a Qualtrics form to get rid of the use of paper and sharing pens. This will take place in the lobby or outside with a social distanced seating arrangement.

Just Dance

Just Dance will be played in the lobby.

We will have spaces marked that are 6 feet apart for each participant to stand on.

COVID-19 UPDATES







Housing and Residence Life has been planning for students on campus for months now, and we continue to modify and add to our plans. We have a plan that covers our facilities, programming, policy changes and procedural changes all as they relate to our students and their well-being. The goal of our plan is to mitigate or prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to manage student needs if they are exposed, or if they test positive for the virus.

You can visit the TCU web page and read more about our campus readiness at www.tcu.edu/connected-campus/campus-readiness. Here are some highlights of our plan for fall:

- We plan to use our halls as designed, but we will have minimal if any double occupancy rooms converted to triple occupancy rooms.
- Lounges and common areas will have furniture laid out to promote social distancing and signage to help students adhere to social distancing guidelines.
- We will have sanitizing stations with wipes and hand sanitizer throughout each hall.
- Housekeeping will have extended cleaning hours and we will do extra sanitizing in high touch areas.
- Guest and visitation policies will be stricter so that we can limit potential spread of the virus.
- Students will be required to wear a mask when they are not in their room, suite or apartment.
- We will have space to isolate students who test positive. Those students will be isolated but well cared for by a designated care coordinator.

The most important part of the plan is that all students recognize they play a critical role in the safety and well-being of others. If all residents take responsibility and follow our rules and guidelines, we can remain on campus and continue to have in-person educational experiences.
